
Outside cylinder cast for 'The Unknown Warrior'

The first outside cylinder for 'The Unknown Warrior' was cast on 16th April at the Coupe Foundry in Preston. Eight days later after cooling, sand in the internal passage ways was removed by digging it out with a crowbar. The casting was then cleaned by shot blasting to reveal the new cylinder - the first new outside Patriot cylinder for over 60 years.

After casting of the second outside cylinder. both cylinders will be taken to Bannway **Engineering for machining** before being taken to Llangollen for fitting to the frames of 'The Unknown Warrior'. The inside cylinder is already at Llangollen waiting to be fitted to the frames of 'The Unknown Warrior' which was due to leave Tyseley during June.

'Rails and Remembrance' Exhibition launched at the People's History Museum, Manchester

The LMS-Patriot Project launched an exhibition - titled 'Rails and Remembrance'. at the People's History Museum in Manchester on 3rd May. The Project has received Heritage Lottery Funding to stage the exhibition.

The exhibition which initially runs from 3rd May to 15th June in the Community Gallery at the People's History Museum, features a specially produced video and exhibition which tell the story of the role Member and supporter of the LMS-Patriot Project, railways played during the Great War and how several Remembrance engines were built as a memorial to the employees of Railway Companies who gave their lives during the Great War.

The 'Rails and Remembrance' video has been produced by Andrew Kennedy, from Oakwood Visuals. Andrew is also filming every stage of the Project and a DVD about creating 'The Unknown Warrior' will be released. The display panels and banners were produced by Peter Alexander for The LMS-Patriot Project.

At the PHM launch, which was also attended by LMS-Patriot Project Members and invited guests, Chris Hughes from BBC TV's Eggheads and also a made a speech on behalf of Project thanking Sally Smith and her colleagues at the Heritage Lottery Fund and Louise Sutherland and Josh Butt at the People's History Museum.

Privateer Beers are producing four specially brewed 'Patriot' themed ales - 'Patriot', 'Illustrious', 'The Unknown Warrior' and 'Lady Godiva' for The LMS-Patriot Project. A donation from the sale of each barrel is being donated by Privateer Beers, to help build 'The Unknown Warrior'. Matt Jervis, who started Privateer Beers, is also a steam railway enthusiast and is keen to support the LMS-Patriot Project.

The first Privateer real ale, 'Patriot', was available to LMS-Patriot Project members and invited guests who attended the opening of the exhibition at the People's History Museum in Manchester on 3rd May. 'Patriot' ale has initially been launched as a cask ale to the trade, and a bottled version of 'Patriot' ale will be available soon, 'Patriot' ale is a 3.9% ABV amber ale brewed with British hops.

Completion of the Rolling Chassis

A look ahead to the second half of 2014 and 2015

With the last of the three cylinders scheduled to be cast at the end of May and machined in June we have seen the end of the really large items needed for The Unknown Warrior. What is left to complete the rolling chassis is highlighted below:

- · Cylinders, motion brackets and motion girders - will be fitted to the frames in June and July 2014.
- **Bogie** all parts for the bogie except the one wheelset are to hand and we expect Tyseley Loco Works to start assembly in July 2014.
- Cylinder Covers we have been offered the patterns for both the front and rear cylinder covers off a rebuilt Scot but unfortunately they are not the same so we are currently seeking quotes for two new patterns.
- Valve Covers these are a standard item and the six covers required will be cast off a borrowed pattern shortly.
- Valve Heads and Rods these have been ordered through Tyseley Loco Works who also require a set for 'Bahamas' which is being overhauled at Tyseley.
- Pistons and Rods these will be ordered in early 2015.
- Sanding Gear drawings are being prepared for this and should be ordered in early 2015.
- Reversing Gear this is a mix of 'Claughton' and 'Royal Scot' and will be drawn up later in 2014 for manufacture in 2015. This will include the Reversing Shaft, Intermediate Reversing Shaft (for the Inside Motion), Mounting Brackets, Bearings and Pins.
- Brake Gear we have a second hand brake cylinder which will be overhauled at Llangollen.

- New Cross Shafts, Pull Bars, Adjusters and Brake Hangers will be required.
- Motion we are short of three slidebars (out of 6), 1 crosshead (out of 3), 3 eccentric rods, inside big end cap, eccentric sheave, eccentric strap, 1 union link, 2 outside return cranks, 3 expansion links, 3 die blocks, 3 valve spindle crossheads and 3 valve spindle crosshead guides. Plus all the associated bearings, pins and cotters.
- Lubrication we have the two mechanical lubricators and some small items but need all the pipework, many junctions and some small lubricators.
- Cylinder Drain Cocks all parts associated with the Drain Cock operating gear will be required.
- Pipe Runs for Vacuum Brakes and Steam **Heating** - we will investigate fitment of these pipe runs.

This might seem quite a lot but by comparison with what has been manufactured it is relatively straightforward. Most of these items can be sponsored and we will happily provide more detailed costings should anyone be interested. Our target is to have all these items made by the end of 2015. Clearly the guicker we can raise the money the quicker we will complete this major stage of the project. Fitting to the frames will progress as we acquire the parts.

Update on the new **Patriot Trading Company**

In the last Warrior we reported on news of a new company set up by the charity called Patriot Enterprises Ltd. This is a wholly owned trading subsidiary of the charity. This means that the new company has issued one share - and that share is owned by the charity. Subject to Company law, its directors are appointed by the charity. They are initially Neil Collinson who will be finance director as well as Treasurer of the charity, and Richard Sant who is Company secretary of both bodies. Three others are being added to the new Board; they will be Andrew Laws (also a charity director), Gavin Shell and Jordan Leeds. Gavin and Jordan have had a long presence within the charity as volunteers.

There are a number of reasons for this. We are approaching the beginning of the end of the build programme, and attention needs to turn to how we trade the locomotive in revenue earning traffic. As the owning company, the charity faces taxation issues if more than a limited amount of income is derived from trading, which explains why bigger charities create subsidiary companies as we have done. The trading profits after costs are gifted to the charity free of corporation tax. As the new company is wholly owned by the charity there is no possibility of conflict between the two. Additionally, we are very aware that the future market for steam locomotives - though we can't see it yet - will progressively contain fewer men in their 60s and older. Look at your Board! So the new company has a majority of younger faces.

In its first year the new company will plan how to earn trading profits but will not have a budget until April 2015, once its business plan is accepted by the charity. There will also be a legal agreement between both entities which confirms that the charity will own the locomotive in perpetuity, but license its use to the trading company.

I'm sure this issue will be the subject of discussion at Members' Day in July and at the AGM in November.

You will also know that we have an administration office in Stafford. There was going to be too much membership business for me to manage from my

were with us when I had to retreat to the garage. Equally, the original plan for membership in 2008 was to create a web-based database system, rather than make relatively expensive use of Claire George's time, so that others could enter and retrieve data. Put both together and you have the justification for an external office; with the rent being covered by volunteer time replacing most of Claire's database work (who still does our financial administration with Neil Collinson). And we also save on postage costs with a simple franking machine and ordering stationery supplies directly from the web. The current office is due for demolition by the local council by March 2015, and so we have agreed to move 200 yards to a new building - still in Stafford. It is currently being refurbished and will perhaps be ready by September this year. The rent will be twice as much as the current premises but still contained within the no net cost increase agreed by the Board. It is bigger so can also manage the trading company's business, subject to its business plan. The council is meeting all our fixed relocation costs. There will be a new telephone number. and to ease the transition we are continuing to use the PO Box number until July 2015. The old telephone number in The Warrior is no longer in use, and you will be advised of the new one and new address as soon as they become operational - please check your letterheads as they will be the first to be changed!



The North Eastern Railway Petrol Electric Autocar

Member Len Clarke has donated a significant amount of Railwayana to the Project from his own personal collection which we have sold to raise funds for 'The Unknown Warrior'. Len is also a Member of the Holmes Chapel Branch of The Royal British Legion and has written an article for the Legion Magazine, which is reproduced here:

Len Clarke, is helping to restore a North Eastern Railway Petrol Electric Autocar that pre-dates WW1 and which will one day help disabled veterans from Iraq and Afghanistan.

Len was born in Norton-on-Tees, County Durham and after the war as a youth became an avid trainspotter. Witnessing the demise of steam in the sixties, he ioined the North Eastern Locomotive Preservation Group to preserve and operate an example of a freight engine of the old North Eastern Railway.

Success followed success until the group ultimately operated eight locomotives mainly on the North Yorkshire Moors Railway, the former Whitby and Pickering Railway and on other preserved railways but also on the mainline.

Len's particular skills are coach painting, lining out and lettering of steam, diesel and electric locomotives. also coaches, into the original liveries of the Victorian and Edwardian era. From his National Service days he recalls saying "If it is still, paint it. If it moves, salute it!" In the last forty odd years Len has painted numerous locos, icons of a long gone steam era including 'Princess Elizabeth', 'Duchess of Hamilton', 'Bittern', 'Union of South Africa', 'Sir Nigel Gresley', 'Blue Peter', 'Taw Valley', and 'Olton Hall' for the Harry Potter films, 'George Stephenson', 'The Great Marquess', 'Lord of the Isles', 'City of Truro', 'Royal Scot' and many more. The largest, was the 270 ton South African Railway, Bever Garratt at the Manchester Museum of Science and Industry. Len has also painted dozens of coaches including 'The Old Gentleman's Saloon' for the film 'The Railway Children'.

Len is also a keen supporter of the Royal British Legion endorsed national memorial engine 'The Unknown Warrior' which is currently under construction. The new steam locomotive, which is being funded mostly from public donations, is expected to be completed for 2018 - the 100th



Anniversary of the Armistice. 'The Unknown Warrior locomotive will be seen by thousands of people around the country and will haul trains as a travelling steam memorial for The Royal British Legion on Britain's railways.

Currently Len's project is the North Eastern Railway Petrol Electric Autocar. This survivor, built at York in 1903 is a wooden carriage, originally powered by a petrol engine driving a generator, to two bogie mounted electric motors. The restoration will include a diesel engine in place of the petrol engine, able to be driven from either end. A forerunner of all modern railway traction it has attracted a major donation from the Heritage Lottery Fund for its restoration. The Autocar's role was in serving rural branch lines and stations in North Yorkshire., County Durham and Northumberland. "It must", says Len "have carried many young recruits for the Army during WW1." After the war, the coach had a more powerful engine fitted to enabling it to operate a second coach, 'the Autocoach', doubling its capacity.

Len is hopeful that when the pair are restored, use can be made by our lads disabled by the war in Iraq and Afghanistan to travel for a day out, with their families in an ideal vehicle as an aid to recuperation and assimilation into the wider community, when the Autocar visits tourist railways around the country. Len's hope is that it will present opportunities for branches of the Royal British Legion to participate.

Treasurer's Report by Neil Collinson

It is now 16 months since I volunteered to assist with some bookkeeping/administrative tasks after an appeal in the December 2012 issue of The Warrior. It is 14 months since I was 'persuaded' to join the board as treasurer and what a year it has been.

I would like to re-iterate that in getting the locomotive ready for Warley, expenditure exceeded income guite considerably. Fortunately we were able to secure short term loans from generous supporters to help us through, which we will need to repay. Our income for the last financial year to 31st March totalled in excess of £235,000. However, expenditure on the engine was £357,000.

Can you help?

Our boiler loan scheme has generated £170,000 in loans and donations so far and there has been an excellent response to our Chairman's appeal. We are almost half way there. We are also benefitting from repayment of loans made to the Tornado appeal due to them receiving a substantial legacy from a will and the lenders re-investing in our appeal. We have had one very kind legacy to date. We are recruiting regular donors consistently and

this source of income now brings in £42,000 per annum, plus gift aid. However, my appeal is to all supporters. Please dig deep and consider a regular donation if you do not already do so. If you do donate this way then please consider an increase to raise our average monthly donation from £14.50, which has remained static for some time. As our chairman's personal letter to you said. 'Regular amounts enable us to plan ahead with confidence,' but ad hoc ones are equally welcome, as is sponsorship of the parts listed on the web-site. As an example our cylinder appeal raised £12,000 (other parts are available - see page 9).

2013 has been a momentous year for our project. Let us continue to make great strides forward so that we can achieve our aim of having 'The Unknown Warrior' ready by 2017.

Boiler Progress Update

The steel former for the backplate for the new copper inner firebox has been started at the workshops of LNWR Heritage in Crewe. This will enable the copper sheet to be formed to create the first large section of the inner firebox of the all new British built boiler for 'The Unknown Warrior'. The order for the formers for the outer steel firebox doorplate and throatplate is to be placed with Tyseley Locomotive Works in the next few weeks.

This will enable the firebox and boiler to be assembled at LNWR Crewe. This will be the first all British built new mainline boiler to be built since 1960.

Engineering Update

Cylinders and motion brackets:

The second outside cylinder was due to be cast during the last week of June at the Coupe Foundry in Preston. Outside cylinders and motion brackets are expected to be fitted during July/ August, the motion girders which have not yet been machined will follow shortly afterwards.

Cylinder covers:

Having discovered that the patterns made for Royal Scot cylinder covers are not the same as the be cast. Patriot, we have now received guotes for polystyrene patterns of the correct design which will be ordered shortly.

The front covers are the same as those on the Jubilee so we have borrowed a wooden pattern for these. The rear covers are different and we have obtained a quote from Premier Patterns for three polystyrene patterns.

The second outside polystyrene cylinder pattern arrived at the Coupe Foundry, in Preston on 10th June which will enable the last cylinder to


