'The Unknown Warrior' Gets Fowler Tender



The tender that will be used with 'The Unknown Warrior' is seen outside for the first time in many years at Barry on May 4th.

A ceremony was held at Barry on 4th May hosted by John Buxton, Chairman of the Cambrian Group. Representatives from the Vale of Glamorgan Council, the GWS, MHR, and the Patriot Project heard Mr Buxton outlining plans for the 'Barry 10' collection including the Fowler tender that has been earmarked for use with 'The Unknown Warrior'.

Cambrian Transport are the new operators of the Barry Island Railway, and will be setting up a steam centre, a railway engineering and restoration facility and also a training academy. Cambrian Transport have taken pocession of the Fowler tender from the Vale of Glamorgan Council and will restore it to mainline condition on behalf of the LMS-Patriot Project. The tender is believed to have entered Woodhams scrapyard behind 2–6–0 'Crab' number 42859. A new tender tank will be built, as the original is badly corroded, having been exposed to the sea air at Barry since arriving in 1967.

Although stored under cover for a number of years in the ex-EWS wagon works at Barry, and prior to that at Bute Road Station in Cardiff and also a bus depot in Barry, the tender has had all the brass bearings stolen and five of the six axle box casings are

damaged. The new tender tank will have an increased water capacity and a reduced coal space. The original capacity was only 3500 gallons of water, but this will be increased for mainline running. The Avon Valley Railway have offered assistance with casting new axle boxes for the tender, and two buffers are also needed. An LMS-Patriot Project supporter has also pledged £10,000 towards the restoration costs. This generous donation will enable the restoration to start soon. Cambrian Transport is planning to set up a rail training academy at Barry for apprentices to work on various railway related projects. The Fowler tender restoration will be one of the first projects that Cambrian tackles at their Barry facilities. Speaking on behalf of the LMS-Patriot Project, Richard Sant, Company Secretary thanked Rhodri Traherne and the Vale of Glamorgan Council and also John Buxton, who has been negotiating with the Council for over 10 years, to find suitable new homes for the 'Barry 10' collection.

It is hoped that 'The Unknown Warrior' will one day visit Barry, in recognition that its tender was sourced and restored at the famous South Wales town.

Engineering Update

The dragbox is now installed in the frames at Llangollen. The bogie bolster pattern has been completed at the Boro Foundry, who also drilled the frame plates for 'The Unknown Warrior' last year. The completed pattern has now moved to the foundry to be cast. Machining of the finished casting will take place within the next four weeks.

A visit to Wroughton in Wiltshire took place at the beginning of June, where all the patterns belonging to Swindon Historic Castings had been stored. This visit has yielded the pattern for the steam manifold and the Ross pop safety valves for 'The Unknown Warrior',

and will save the project around £10,000 in pattern making fees. The patterns are now safely in dry storage.

Our CAD designer, Kevin West, recently visited West Coast Railways at Carnforth, where he was able to view the hornguides on Jubilees 'Galatea', and 'Leander' and also on 'Scots Guardsman'. This will allow us to produce the necessary drawings for 'The Unknown Warrior'. Kevin is also working on drawings for four of the five frame stretchers and these are nearly completed. These are the next items to be ordered for the frames.

Recycle for Cash

Patriot Facts

Most of the Patriots were built at Crewe Locomotive Works. 40 of the 52 were in fact built at Crewe.

10 Patriots never received names including 45551. Although this had been allocated the name 'Rothesay', but this name was never fitted.

18 Patriots were rebuilt with a Stanier 2A taper boiler, rendering them almost identical in appearance and performance with the 'Royal Scot' class which had also been rebuilt since they were originally built.

The Corwen Patriot Gala

Many of you will have visited the three day 'Corwen Patriot Gala' which took place over the 23rd - 25th April. The Gala was jointly staged between The Llangollen Railway and The LMS-Patriot Project to raise funds and awareness for the extension from Carrog to Corwen as well as for 'The Unknown Warrior'. The Llangollen Railway has recently had the final objection against the extension withdrawn, and it's now very much the green light, if funding from the Welsh Assembly and local authority is forthcoming. On the first day of the Gala a special train, sponsored by Steam Railway magazine, ran non-stop from Llangollen to Carrog. 'The Corwen' express departed Llangollen at 11am hauled by newly restored BR Standard 2-6-4T number 80072 and visiting guest engine, Stanier 'Mogul' number 42968. On arrival at Carrog around 40 people embarked on a walk along the trackbed to Corwen - a distance of around 3 miles, effectively becoming the first passengers to arrive in the town for the first time in 46 years! The Gala was well attended and the visiting engine, 42968 was a popular choice for the Gala, given that

most events this year have a GWR flavour! The LMS-Patriot Project had its sales stand on platform 1 at Llangollen station and volunteers from the Project were also in the Works to show visitors the progress of 'The Unknown Warrior'. The newly fitted dragbox could be seen fitted to the frames. The LMS-Patriot Project had a successful weekend and received some significant donations from a couple of Members who visited the Gala. We would like to express our thanks to Mr Briddon and to Mr Collins who made extremely generous donations, which will enable some of the stretchers, the smoke deflectors and some of the cab to be funded. We also collected Gift Aid from ticket sales and with other donations will enable us to allocate around £1000 to the building of the cab. It is planned that this will go on display at Crewe Heritage Centre, although this probably won't

Fawley Hill is the estate and private railway museum of Sir William McAlpine, who has built up a large collection of artifacts including a working 0-6-0 saddle tank engine – number 31, which was built by Hudswell Clark in 1931 and used by the McAlpine Company until being 'rescued' by Sir William. The LMS-Patriot Project has a number of tickets which are being offered to LMS-Patriot Project Members on a first come, first served basis at £11 each.
